For years, **Brother Joachim Zavodka**—a member of the OLPH community in Manhattan—had a small statue of Brother André Bissette, CSC, on his desk. Today it is Saint André. When Brother Joachim died, February 24, 1958, it was recalled how similar the two saintly brothers were. He, too, was an amiable porter and beloved by all.

Born October 31, 1877, in Necpaly, Turcianska Zupa, Czechoslovakia, he came to America in 1906 and took a job as a waiter. Four years later he entered the Congregation. He served at Ilchester from 1911-1912 and again from 1915-1916. He served the Bohemians at St. Wenceslaus in Baltimore from 1916-1918 and again from 1921-1924. But the Czech parish of OLPH on East 61<sup>st</sup> Street held his heart from 1912-1915, 1918-1921, and 1924-1958.

Owing to his interest in the Oriental liturgy, on the evening before his funeral, Father Clement Englert intoned a *panachida* before Brother's coffin—the equivalent of the *Libera* in the Eastern rite.
